





Public Trust in Government: 1958-2021

Public trust in government remains low. Only about one-quarter of Americans say they can trust the government in Washington to do what is right "just about always" (2%) or "most of the time" (22%).



• 49%	Presidential Election Decided by 5 points or less before Afghanistan Withdrawal; before Vaccine Mandate
• 46%	60% Disapprove of Handling of Southern Border
• 42%	54% Say Incomes Not Keeping Up With Prices
• 38%	Majorities in all districts disapproved of:
• 37%	-Defunding the police -Abolishing ICE
• 36%	-Green New Deal
• 33%	-Medicare for All






INFLATION ACROSS ENTIRE ECONOMY


YEAR-OVER-YEAR CHANGE IN CPI BY COMPONENT CATEGORY, 2000 TO PRESENT, PERCENT







CPI Loss Foco we Diekov



Trade Policy and Supply Chains

- EU Steel/Aluminum Trade Pact
 - Managed Trade versus Free Trade
- China: Trump Doctrine Continuation
- Ag Exports Set Record
 - \$173.5 billion FY 2021
 - \$177.5 billion forecast for FY 2022
- Can we handle more?





Infrastructure and Supply Chain Relief

- Permits those 18 to 21 years old to operate a commercial vehicle across state lines
- Hours-of-Service restrictions on livestock haulers lifted within 150 miles of their destination.
- Ocean Shipping Reform Act Passed House 364-60
 - Part of Coast Guard Reauthorization this year

U.S. Department of Announcements

- USDA has announced a comprehensive package of investments related to climate and sustainability.
- USDA is preparing \$3 billion in investments that will support drought resilience and response.
- \$500 million to support drought recovery and encourage the adoption of water-smart management practices.
- \$500 million to provide relief from agricultural market disruption.
- Up to \$1.5 billion to help schools respond to supply chain disruptions.
- USDA Invests \$700 million to Provide Relief to Small Producers, Processors, Distributors, Farmers Markets and Seafood Processing Vessels and Processors Impacted by COVID-19.
- USDA Announces Additional Aid to Ag Producers and Businesses in Pandemic Assistance for Producers Initiative ----Since January, USDA has allocated \$11B to producers and food and ag business.
- USDA to Invest More Than \$4 Billion to Strengthen Food System ----Investments Will Support Biden Administration's Effort to Strengthen Critical Supply Chains.
- The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) today announced the availability of more than \$330 million to help agricultural producers and organizations in the food supply chain recover from the financial impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic.
